Located in the former Lowry AFB on the east side of Denver, Wings Over the Rockies Air and Space Museum is housed in the 30,000 sq. ft. World War II-era Hangar No. 1. It is filled with over three dozen historic airplanes and space vehicles. Our guided tour will start at 10am, and all will have time to explore on their own after the lunch program.

From North/South I-25: Go North on Colorado Blvd. to Alameda; East (right) to Fairmount Dr.; North (left) straight through the roundabout; turn right on Academy Blvd.

From East/West I-70: South on Quebec Street; turn east on 1st Ave., go .25 miles and turn right onto Roslyn Street. Roslyn then curves around to the left and becomes Academy Blvd. You will see the B-52 on the left side of the road!

From I-225: Alameda exit West to Fairmount Dr.; North to Academy Blvd. turn right; museum on the left.
