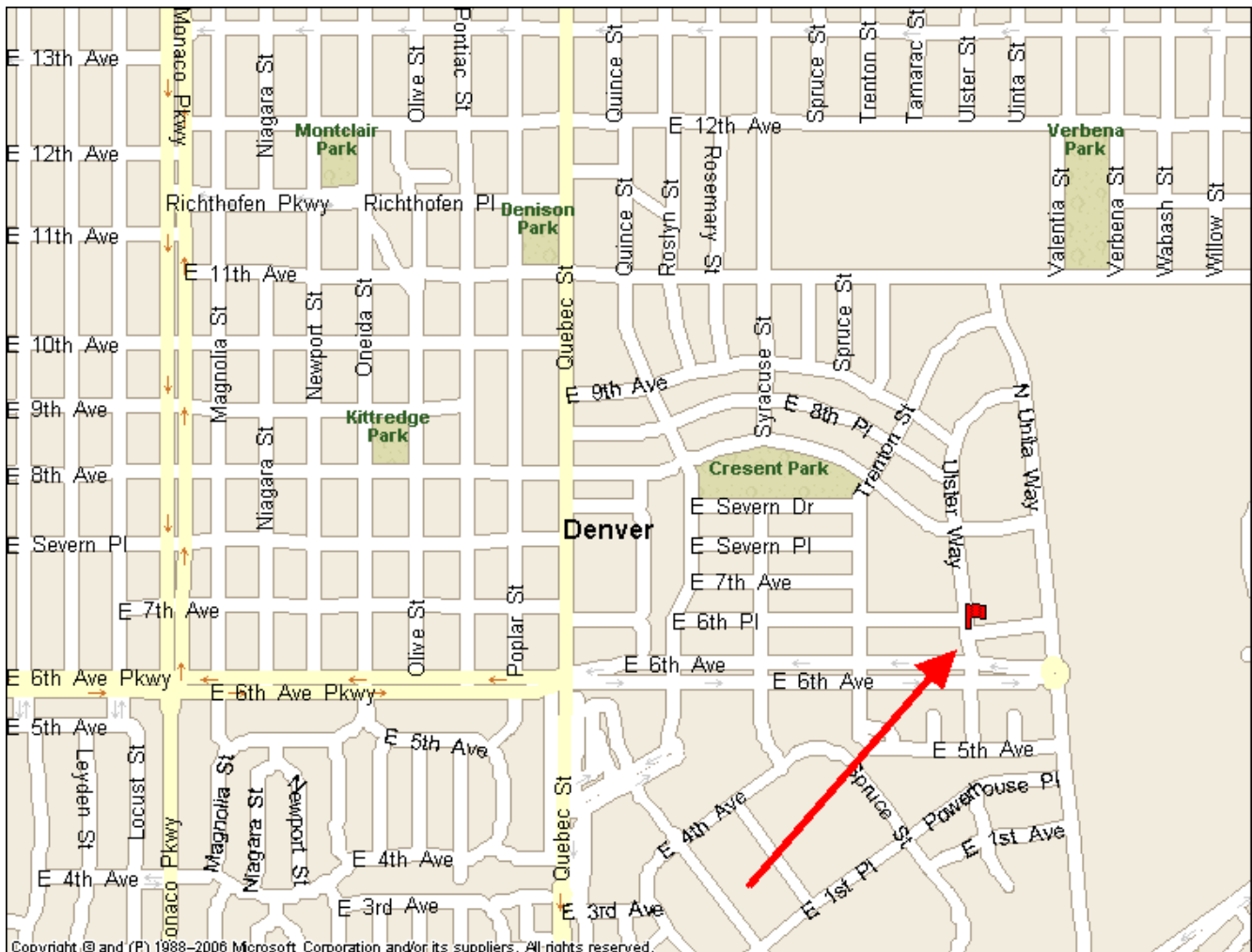

Bill Addresses Common Type of Crash



Bicycle Colorado is endorsing a bill introduced in the Colorado legislature that aims to create broader range of consequences for persons failing to yield right of way resulting in bodily injury or death.

This bill gives the justice system more options when injury results from someone failing to yield the right of way.

Sponsored by Rep. Marostika and Sen. Brophy, House Bill 1104 creates a new Class 1 misdemeanor traffic offense called "aggravated right of way offense." Right of way infractions are responsible for many crashes involving bicycles and motor vehicles. Under the current system, when those at fault may be charged with penalties as minor as a \$10 fine.

News from FRCC Colorado Springs

The 2008 competitive cycling season is rapidly approaching! In preparation for the new season, the Front Rangers Cycling Club of Colorado Springs (FRCC) is holding their first meeting of 2008 on March 5 at 7pm in the Ray Essicks room on the campus of the United States Olympic Committee in Colorado Springs. This first meeting will be an opportunity to reconnect with returning members, discuss the coming season, and welcome new members to the team.

The FRCC's mission is "to positively impact our local youth through the competitive

sport of cycling." The club goals include: having fun, building character, and pushing riders to meet their performance goals. The club is specifically for members 12-18 years of age (with some stipulations about bike fit, coach to rider ratios, etc), and is a growing force in the cycling community. Club members can receive instruction, coaching, and direction in any of four cycling disciplines offered through the club (road, track, mountain, and cyclocross), as well as on different levels of ability and desire to participate. Last season the FRCC started with eleven members, finished with 25 members, and hope to see further growth this season. The club is a non-profit organization and has a long history of operating through the support from volunteers in the Colorado Springs community. These volunteers consist of parents, cycling enthusiasts, professional coaches, and other interested members of the community.

We're excited to get our club members together again to kick-off the new season, as well as to welcome any new comers who want to enjoy the sport and recreation of cycling this season.
